

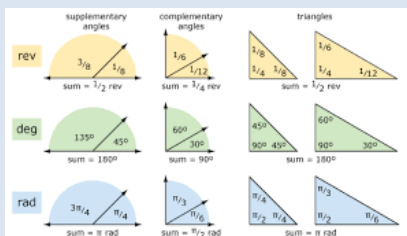


Year Six Term Four Overview 2017

Literacy

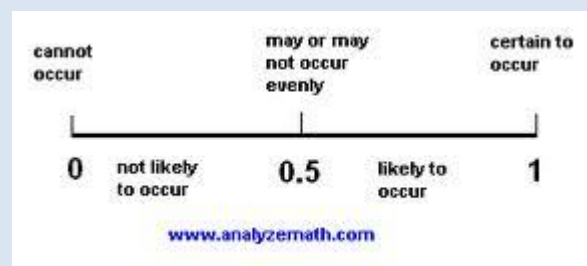
The students will commence the term with the planning, drafting, editing and publishing of a big book for their Foundation buddy. They will focus on the structure and linguistic features that come with picture story books. The students will read, analyse, and write a variety of poems. In doing so, they will understand how poets use Figurative Language to convey their message and add interest for the reader. Comparing, connecting, clarifying, questioning and summarising texts will continue to be a focus through independent reading and explicit teaching within small groups. The students will be given the opportunity to plan and participate in debates through synthesising, and using information from a variety of texts based on the same topic. Weekly S.M.A.R.T spelling sessions based on spelling patterns will continue until the conclusion of the school year.

Numeracy



The emphasis this term will be on probability, statistics, measurement, shapes, location and transformation of objects. The students will draw and measure angles and interpret data displays. They will describe probabilities using

fractions, decimals and percentages. They will continue solving multi step word problems. To consolidate terms and concepts covered in Semester One and gain a further appreciation of the impact of



Mathematical information on daily life, the students will complete activities from The Mathematics Programme.

Religious Education : *The Year Six students will continue their Unit: Teach Us To Pray, from Term Three. We will investigate Mary as the perfect disciple and examine the place prayer has in our lives. We will pray The Rosary for the month of October.*

Who is Mary in the Christian tradition? How does Mary show Christians to live as disciples?

Understandings:

Mary, mother of Jesus Christ, is the perfect disciple. Discipleship is listening to the word of God in your life, and responding.

Wait for the Saviour He Will Come.

What is Advent and Christmas? How is God revealed to us in the Scriptures?

What does revelation mean for me today?

Understandings:

Advent is a time of preparing and waiting for the celebration of the Saviour's birth and of looking forward to the time when he will come again in glory.

The telling and reading of Scripture reveals the story of God's people and their relationship with God.

Inquiry:



In our unit 'Events That Shaped Our World,' the students will undertake a Scientific, Geographical, Political or Historical investigation into one significant event that changed our world. They will understand that the lives we lead today are the result of the ideas, inventions and decisions made by other people.



In our final unit **Upgrade: Journey Into Year Seven**, the focus will be their transition to secondary school. We will examine the expectations that will be placed on them and the many changes that they will experience, as they move forward with their learning.
